The St Just and Land's End peninsula is a secret corner of Cornwall waiting to be discovered.

At the heart of the community is St Just in Penwith, with its range of shops, pubs, cafes and galleries. The Plen-an-Gwary (place of the play) in the centre of the town is one of only two surviving outdoor medieval amphitheatres in Cornwall.

Across the peninsula you will find many thriving and unique towns, villages and hamlets, each with its own distinctive character and each offering a warm welcome at any time of the year.

We invite you to take some time to visit the many local shops selling fine foods and locally produced goods and browse the wealth of galleries filled with arts and crafts produced by local artists, many items inspired by the coast and countryside of the far West of Cornwall.

Designated as an Area of Outstanding Natural Beauty, the peninsula has some of the most spectacular scenery and glorious beaches in the South West.

Visit the rugged north coast with its granite cliffs, rocky coves, sandy beaches, mining heritage and Cape Cornwall, the only cape in England.

Travel round the rocky outcrop of Land's End to the south coast where lush farmland leads down coastal valleys to secluded sandy coves and tranquil sheltered harbours.

Venture inland and the countryside continues to delight with granite moorland and an unspoilt patchwork of ancient fields shaped in prehistoric times where you will find a network of footpaths making the area a walker's paradise.

Why not relax and leave the car behind. The car parks in St Just and Pendeen provide an ideal base for exploring on foot, by bike or by bus.

Play a round of golf, take a ride on the open top bus along the coast road, spend a day on golden sands and bathe, surf or just paddle in the clear blue waters that surround the peninsula. Or why not unwind with a drink and a meal at one of a generous choice of inns, cafes and restaurants serving fresh local produce.

If you have not yet discovered the St Just and Land's End area then we suggest you open up our map, see what the area has to offer, and take the time to enjoy.
